
GENERAL INFORMATION

Hebden Hey Scout Centre, run by the Halifax District Scouts, provides excellent self-catering accommodation throughout the year for mixed parties of up to 44 and 30 persons in two separate hostels. An activity room opens onto the main field and a day centre is located below the Tom Bell hostel. £1.6 million was spent on renovating the nearby Gisbon Mill in 2007.

- Rental charges include gas for hot water, central heating and cooking
- Electric socket outlets, appliances, and drying rooms are operated on £1 coin meters.
- A payphone is available for use by visitors
- Dogs and pets are not allowed in the buildings.
- Twelve individual camp sites are available for Scouts and Guides only.
- The 37 acre site is surrounded by large woodlands owned by the National Trust, which are open to the public.

Additionally, both the Pennine Way and Calderdale Way pass close to the Centre and climbers can take advantage of the nearby Widdop rocks. There is an official Hardcastle Crags Trail, and the South Pennine Centre at Hebden Bridge, along with its various attractions, is only 11/2 miles away.

HEBDEN HEY HOSTEL

Accommodation for a maximum of 44 people.

Upstairs

- lounge
- four bedrooms, each equipped with double tier bunks beds with mattresses for 18, 16, six and four respectively.

Downstairs


- 2 separate toilets and shower rooms
- 2 joined kitchens
- 2 dining rooms

Each kitchen has a comprehensive set of equipment including gas cooker, fridge and freezer, crockery, cutlery and cooking utensils.

Practical features include a boot lobby, drying room and conservatory.

- 5 bedrooms
- large main hall (for activities, dining and socialising)
- large drying room

Downstairs


• 3 toilets/washrooms, each with a shower.

The kitchen and bedrooms are similarly equipped to those in the Hebden Hey hostel.

DAY CENTRE

This facility provides daytime indoor accommodation and can be booked on a daily basis.

There is a kitchen and the main hall has a wood-burning stove, and tables and chairs for up to 30 people. The two toilets and showers are also available for use by campers.



CAMPING

The Centre has several sites of various sizes, suitable for either one night expeditions or longer stays. Our sites are open from March to October, and are only available to Scout and Guide members.



There is access to toilets and showers. Some sites have small altar fires, although there is access to the campfire circle for all site users.

Hebden Hey Scout Centre is ideally placed in the Pennine foothills for camping and exploring the region.
